



Discussion of Goals and Strategies

Discussion of Goals and Strategies

- Submission of Open Call applications creates opportunity to revisit/refine goals and strategies to ensure that potential projects can be placed within an appropriate goal and strategy.
- Suggest merging Goal #1 (connectivity) and Goal #2 (walking and biking environment).
- Suggest modifying Goal #3 (beautification) to better reflect support for business improvements/expansions (i.e. interior improvements as well as exterior).

Proposed Downtown Goal #1

Enhance Downtown Lindenhurst's connection to the rest of the Village and to the region while creating a safe, comfortable walking and biking environment.

Strategies:

- Improve the physical appearance at and around the Long Island Rail Road station to create a stronger sense of arrival into Downtown Lindenhurst.
- Create a greenway network linking parks and open spaces within and near the Downtown, including through the use of the Heling and Neguntatogue Creeks.
- Implement intersection, streetscape, sidewalk, and parking lot improvements, with a focus on Hoffman and Wellwood Avenues and other pedestrian safety hot spots.
- Create a biking network through infrastructure improvements including bike lanes, improved bike share systems, and other amenities.

Proposed Downtown Goal #2

Cultivate a supportive environment for local businesses and beautify the Downtown area as an attractive place to visit and explore.

Strategies:

- Facilitate enhancements to building facades and business improvements, especially along Hoffman Avenue.
- Enlarge and upgrade Village Square as a focus for Downtown activities throughout the year.
- Identify and mark gateways, streetscapes, and civic spaces through improved signage, landscaping, and public art, and a cohesive wayfinding system to allow visitors to find public parking and other Downtown amenities.
- Design and implement a marketing and branding strategy to identify Lindenhurst as a downtown of choice for the South Shore and greater Long Island.

Proposed Downtown Goal #3

Strengthen Lindenhurst's arts and historic assets to establish the Village as a regional cultural destination.

Strategies:

- Support existing theaters to increase their visibility within Downtown Lindenhurst and expand their reach.
- Assist historical organizations and museums in improving their facilities to broaden programming, activities and public events.
- Increase opportunities for new public art in the Downtown area.

Project Evaluation Criteria and "Homework" Handout

Project Evaluation

Objective

- Provide the LPC with a preliminary tool to begin considering which projects would have the greatest impact.
- Rate each project on five criteria to evaluate the relative impact of each project.
- Offer subjective guidance on the potential economic impact and community benefits that each project could provide.

Criteria for Evaluating NYF Projects

- 1. Does this project meet the State and Local DRI Goals?
- 2. Does the project have the potential to create a catalytic effect?
- 3. Is the project ready to be implemented?
- 4. Is the project cost effective?
- 5. Does the project have co-benefits?

Project Evaluation Criteria

- Alignment with State and Local Goals: NYF State Goals
 - Active downtown with a strong sense of place
 - Attract new businesses
 - Enhance public spaces for arts and cultural events
 - Build a diverse population supported by diverse housing and employment opportunities
 - Grow the local property tax base
 - Enhance downtown living and quality of life
 - Support resiliency
- 2 Catalytic Effect

The project is likely to have a significant positive impact on the revitalization of the downtown by attracting other public and private investment.

3 Project Readiness

The project should be well-developed and ready to proceed in the near-term.

4 Eligible Project Type

The project must be one of the eligible project types.

5 Cost Effectiveness


Investment of NYF funds in the project would represent an effective and efficient use of public resources.

6 Co-Benefits

The project will result in secondary benefits to the community.

LPC "Homework" - Initial Project Review

- Use the Project Review handout to provide your notes, comments, and questions for each project.
 - Comments should help the project team follow-up with applicants.
 - Notes should be submitted to the project team by August 23^{nd -} two weeks before LPC #4.

Discussion of Potential NYF Projects

Considerations for Project Evaluation

For all potential NYF Projects

- Lindenhurst has a limited amount of funding through the NYF program—not every project will be funded.
- Some related projects may be combined.
- Project details will be refined in coordination with the project sponsor.

Proposals by LPC Members

- During discussion of projects, LPC members with conflicts of interest may provide factual information, but otherwise must not advocate on behalf of their own projects.
- Must recuse themselves from the project selection process with regard to their own projects.

Target for Matching Funds?

- There are no programmatic minimum match requirements for the NYF with the exception of a small project fund.
 - For a small project fund, matching requirements must be no less than 25% of the total cost per project.
- However, the LPC can decide whether the require or target a "match" from project sponsors (such as 30% of the total cost).
 - The sponsor should demonstrate a "gap" in funding (i.e. the project would not occur without NYF funding).
- Projects should have financing commitments largely secured or be able to demonstrate a clear path to securing sufficient financing. It is strongly encouraged that all projects, especially private projects, use non-NYF funds that leverage requested public funding.

Open Call for Project Proposals

- 36 total project submissions
- 5 public project submissions
- 31 private/non-profit submissions
- Wide range of creative project types:
 - Façade improvements
 - Streetscape/greenway design
 - Mural and public art
- NYF funding requests range from \$4,700 to \$2,000,000
- Total NYF request from Open Call projects is about \$7.3M, leveraging an additional \$5.2M, for a total investment of nearly \$12.5M

Discussion Topics for the LPC

- 1. Which projects will have the greatest impact on downtown economic development?
- 2. Can some projects be combined?
- 3. What is the NYF need? NYF funds can be used to make up a financing gap, but the applicant must demonstrate need—if the project could proceed without NYF, then it's not a good use of State funds.
- 4. Do project sponsors have the capacity to implement the project?
- 5. In addition to the State's minimum thresholds, the LPC could consider other requirements.

Initial NYF Evaluation: Project Categories

1. Strong NYF Projects

- Projects that may stand a good chance of being included in the plan and ultimately funded by the state.
- Note that this categorization does not guarantee inclusion in the plan—that decision is up to the LPC.

2. Potential NYF Projects with Questions

- Projects that are likely eligible but raise questions about project readiness, private leverage, site control, etc.
- Sponsor's response to preliminary questions could make each of these projects stronger or may demonstrate that they're not quite ready for NYF.

3. Project Ideas That are Not Eligible or Ready for NYF.

- Projects with ineligible activities, such as ongoing programming expenses or removable equipment.
- Some projects are potentially eligible for NYF funding, but there are significant questions/issues, such as site control, capacity to implement, etc.
- Some of these projects could be suitable to be implemented through the Small Project Fund (max. \$300,000)

Tesla Rideshare – 3 month Pilot

Description

Rove proposes a 3 month pilot project (October 2023- December 2023) to operate 2 Teslas within the Lindenhurst downtown for residents and visitors to access free-rides via an app.

Issues / Questions

- Project timing is too soon NYF planning process isn't complete until late 2023
- Project doesn't appear eligible funding would be for drivers (i.e. programmatic).




